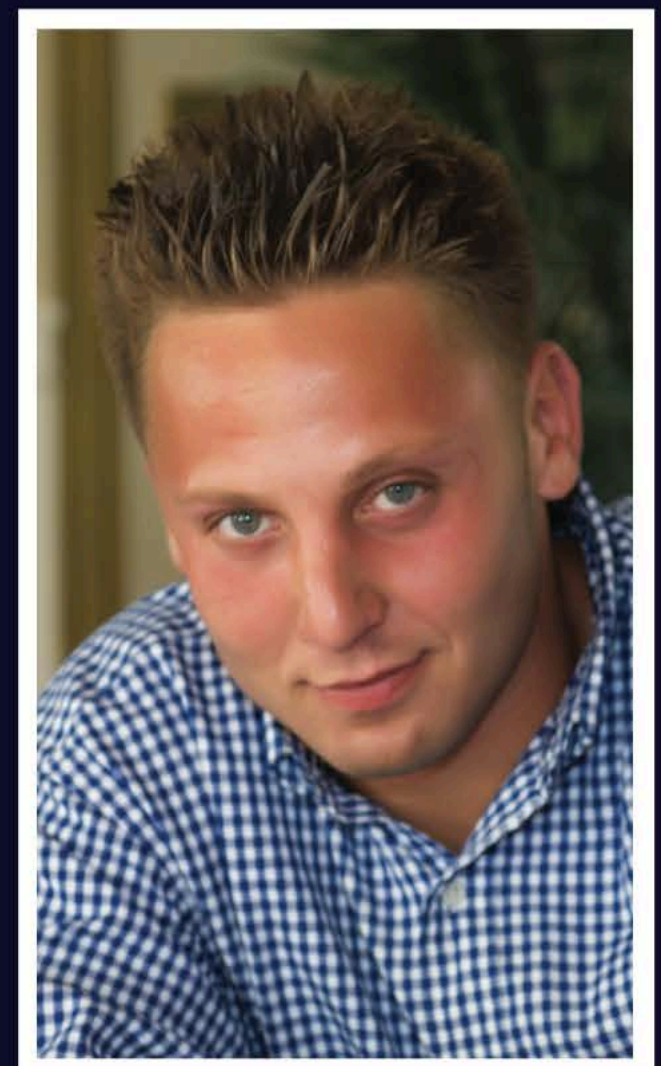

Mission and Accomplishments

Tigger's family is active as philanthropists in the community. They have courageously decided to honor their son and take a resolute stand to fight the raging opiate/heroin epidemic devastating our youth. Tigger House Inc. was inspired by the devastating suffering and profound love of a family who lost their son and brother "Tigger" at 25 years of age to an accidental overdose. Tigger House Foundation is based in Monmouth County. Tigger grew up on the Jersey Shore where he went to school, was loved by many friends and family, and lived a very full life. The Tigger House Foundation, is a non-profit dedicated to achieving a positive impact by reducing the death rate of overdoses caused by heroin & opiate addiction. The Stavola family created the foundation in 2013, to honor their son Tigger, who was tragically lost to a heroin overdose at age 25. Tigger House works to eliminate the negative stigma behind addiction recovery. The foundation strives to defeat the epidemic that is destroying lives in Monmouth County and NJ at alarming rates. For the past 5 years, we have successfully provided programs to over a 1,000 individuals and created services at Monmouth Medical Center and Riverview Medical Center. The Tigger Addiction Recovery Program at Monmouth Medical Center has provided help to over 350 people who received drug treatment in 2018. Our Student Alliance and Law Enforcement Leaders program is growing and we are working toward building our vision of a campus to help those who are seeking recovery.

Mission

To educate students about the disease of addiction and the consequences that addiction can have on one's physical and mental health, family, relationships, and other areas of functioning; and learn how and why substances are abused.



5 Requirements

Require students and teachers to receive training twice a year on the disease of addiction



Require the Law Enforcement Leaders of THF to educate students on opioid overdose twice a year



Require each school hosting a tigger Alliance Club to research, record and report how they are educating their students on the disease of addiction and opioid overdose



Enact a policy that will protect students from legal ramifications should they report an opioid overdose or help another student seek addiction treatment



Good Samaritan Law - protecting students who come to the aid of someone suffering from an opioid overdose or seeking addiction treatment
